

Which patients require a fetal echocardiogram?

- History of diabetes or abnormal glucose screening in early pregnancy
- Fetuses with a thickened nuchal translucency
- Family history of a congenital heart defect
- Exposure to medications known to cause heart defects (i.e. Lithium, anticonvulsants)
- Abnormal 4 chambered views on the Level II sonogram
- Fetus known to have an aneuploidy or a congenital malformation or with a high suspicion of an aneuploidy or a congenital malformation
- Fetal arrhythmia
- Exposure to Rubella
